Go Wild is a new style of native forest restoration manual, combining the "how to" with the stories of people who have done it, inspire it and live it.

The Go Wild manual guides you through the restoration process, from choosing a site and plants, to establishing "pioneers", feeding native birds, protecting your regenerating bush from stock and predators, "making weeds work for you", establishing wildlife corridors, restoring dunes and wetlands, trapping pests. It details covenanting, funding agencies and sources of advice. Restoration offers many challenges and this publication is invaluable to those contemplating a project.
