If you need a refresher on the nature and function of estuaries, you'll find that in our newsletter too.



OUR MARCH / APRIL REPORT

Results for the DOC 150 trapping network are seasonally low over this period - **March:** 2 rats **April:** 6 rats

Michael Brewer, who is poisoning wilding pines in the park, has purchased an automatic AT220 trap.

This is a resetting possum and rat trap that uses a mayonnaise lure. In March Michael set this up on Cruise Control and then, in April he moved it to Glade Runner. Both sites are inside the established trapping ring, and kills are much higher than expected for a single trap -

March Cruise control: 4 rats I possum. Are our DOC 150s very effective, or is mayonnaise the secret? We will investigate further.

April Glade Runner: 8 recorded strikes (3 bodies)

In May a group of Whenua iti students will be setting up trapping tunnels to record predator activity in the Rimu Grove area and also carry out trap maintenance.

A big thanks to Pic's Peanut Butter for supporting community conservation, helping to make New Zealand predator free.

Pic's supplies peanut butter as trapping bait - trappers report that predators rats and other predators find it irresistible!

Pic's Peanut Butter for traps \$15 per 5kg (incl. shipping)

Waste/end of run peanut butter is given to community groups for the cost of shipping and handling.

A small amount of blue powdered food dye has been added to the tub as an indicator this is not for human consumption. The 5kg bucket will bait over 1,000 traps.

One bucket only per order: no shipping to the Chatham Islands.
